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Exceptional Care Planning in Nursing Homes

What is Exceptional Care Planning (ECP)?

Most existing care plan processes in nursing homes are inefficient, lengthy and repetitive. Exceptional Care Planning is a different approach to care planning that replaces this existing wasteful care planning process with an efficient and cost-saving one.

ECP uses Standards of Care (SOCs) as a baseline for care. The SOCs are universal and complement the care plan.

The individual care plan then spells out specific needs of the individual resident that supplement and/or differ from the SOCs. Therefore, the care plan process is transformed from one that involves developing and using lengthy, repetitive, non-resident specific care plans for documenting care to one that uses highly personalized individualized care plans that take less time to write and implement, i.e., more quality in less time.

If you work in a nursing home and answer "Yes" to one of more of these questions, this conference is for you!

Are your care plans extremely lengthy?

Are your care plans repetitive?

Do caregivers have difficulty finding resident care needs?

Do your care plans require a great deal of staff time?

Does your care plan system require you to document in multiple areas?

Are your care plans multidisciplinary instead of interdisciplinary?
